1. Meeting was opened at 7:00 by President Rusty Wolf. The Pledge of Allegiance followed the opening.
2. Pres. Wolf acknowledged two new members in attendance.
3. Secretary Report: Pres. Wolf as Acting Secretary briefly discussed the Nov. 2017 minutes and Bruce Scott made a motion to approve, Steve Linn seconded and the motion was accepted.
4. Treasurer's Report: Treas. Fred Rockafellow gave the December 2017 financial report. Fred also mentioned that he is working with the firm of Anderson & Mertz to get the club IRS 501c3. Ron Engles made a motion to accept the Treas. Report, Audrey Stearns seconded the motion and motion passed. Fred will wait until April to contact Mertz with the 501c3 status.
5. Introduction of the new Vilas County Recreation Officer: Pres. Wolf introduced Deputy Will Kreuger to the club and Will gave a nice presentation about himself and his job in Vilas County. Will answered many questions from club members. The club thanked Will for attending the meeting and wished him congratulations on the pending arrival of their next baby due very soon.
6. Committee Reports:
 - a. Clothing sales: Elaine Kloiber was not in attendance but the club discussed ordering clothing online and from Elaine at the next meeting. Chris Kloiber along with Carole Linn and Glen Dalton are working on getting the clothing store on our website soon.

 - c. Business Partnership: Holly T. gave the club an update on the status of Business Partnership Donations. We are at what we had in the budget for donations with the second mailing about to start.
7. Activities Report: Pres. Wolf was going to introduce our new VP to the club but Chuck Bodie was on vacation so we will wait until next month.
